

POLICE CIRCULAR ORDER No. 132

instances have been come to notice when Districts/Establishments have requested this office to reserve beds in the recognised sanatoriums for the treatment of Policemen declared to have been attacked with T.B. but have not forwarded the X-ray plate and the medical report. Since in the absence of these reports, the Medical Officer of the Sanatoriums is unable to offer an opinion about the suitability of the patient for treatment, the admission of the patient have been delayed, which should be avoided specially in T.B. cases. It is, therefore, directed that immediately on receipt of information from the Civil Surgeon or the Provincial T.B. Officer, Orissa, as the case may be, that a Policeman is suffering from T.B. Superintendent of Police/Heads of Establishments should obtain the X-ray plate and the medical reports and send them to the Medical Superintendent, Union Mission Tuberculosis Sanatoriums. Arogyavaram, Madanapalli, South India, direct for the opinion as to the suitability of the patient for admission into the Sanatorium and inform this office.

The Medical Superintendent of the said Sanatorium has been requested to communicate his opinion to you direct under intimation to this office. On receipt of the report of the Medical Superintendent, this office will issue the necessary instructions to you to send the patient to the Sanatorium as early as possible.
