POLICE ORDER No. 114

Prohibition of the stay of outsiders in Police Barracks.

It has come to notice that outsiders stay in some Police barracks more or less permanently with their relations who are police men. It is therefore, ordered that stay of outsiders in Police barracks should be strictly prohibited. Exception may be made only with the written permission of the Officer-in-charge in case of near relations who may have come to see a member of the force for a very limited period, say 2/3 days. Names of such outsiders who are permitted to stay should find entry in a register to be maintained for the purpose. This should contain his name and address, his relationship, the purpose for which he has come and the duration of his stay. In this connection a reference may be had to Police Circular 2/47 also, which deals with prohibition of entry to office permises by unauthorised persons.
