## \* POLICE ORDER No. 162

Anti-Smuggling cases submission

In view of the apprehended scarcity of foodstuffs in the State, Government have since imposed ban on movement of foodgrains from Orissa to outside the State with effect from 19-3-1957 with the object of conserving adequate quantity of foodstuffs within Orissa for future emergencies. In of Statement, order to achieve this object, Government have opened some anti-smuggling check-gates and posts and sanctioned a number of Police staff besides Civil Supplies anti-smuggling guards for the districts concerned (i. e., Balasore, Mayurbhanj, Ganjam, Koraput, Kalahandi, Sundergarh, Keonjhar) but the detection of anti-smuggling cases has not been adequate.

> In order to exercise an effective check in the working of the Police staff employed on antismuggling duties and to know the total value of the properties siezed in connection with each case and as unclaimed, the Superi tendents of Police co-cerned will, hereafter, submit monthly and quarterly returns of smuggling case in the following *Pro forma* with ther monthly/quarterly Crime Review to judge the outturn of work of the anti-smuggling staff.

> It is further noticed that the staff engaged in anti-smuggling duties continue indefinitely, which is undesirable. The staff should not remain at any anti-smuggling post for over 3 months and should not be employed on anti-smuggling duties for a period exceeding six months.
