

POLICE ORDER No. 232

SUBJECT—Saluting to the Director / Deputy / Assistant Director of Treasuries and Inspections

A doubt has arisen as to whether the Inspecting Officers of the Director of Treasuries are to be saluted with present arms by the Treasury / Sub-Treasury guard. Since they are not connected with the Police as Inspecting Officers, as the dignatories and officials mentioned in P. M. R. 607 (b) and (c) are in one way or the other, the question of the guard turning for inspection and presenting arms to them does not arise. But however, salute being a mark of general courtesy, it may be offered as freely as possible to senior officers.

It is, therefore, ordered that the sentry of the Treasury / Sub-Treasury guard shall give a 'butt salute' to the Director / Deputy / Assistant Director of the Directorate of Treasuries and Inspection once a day when they pass by whereas on the other times the sentry shall come to attention. In case other members of the guard are present at the time the sentry given the 'butt salute', they should come to attention.
