

POLICE CIRCULAR ORDER No. 134

in order to ensure the expeditious despatch and production of accused persons and prisoners arrested in one State but required in another State in connection with an investigation or trial there, it is necessary that the State effecting the arrest should initially provide the necessary escort for despatch of such prisoners to the State where they are wanted.

It is therefore, ordered that in future whenever a prisoner is arrested in this State, requisite resort shall be provided by the Superintendent of police of the district in which he is arrested under intimation to the Assistant Inspector-General. Similarly, when a prisoner/accused person, wanted in a case of this State, is arrested in another State, the Police authorities of the State effecting the arrest shall be requested by the district Superintendent of police, concerned, to arrange despatch of the prisoner (s) to this State under the escort of the Police of that State and of other States that lie *en route*.

The provisions of P. M. Rule 554 relating to relief of inter-State escort shall, however, be followed as usual.
