

POLICE ORDER No. 144

Inspections
of wireless
establish-
ments.

The Dy. I-G., Tech. shall make an annual inspection of the State Headquarters Signal Office and the Superintendent of Police, Signals shall make an inspection once a year of his office and important W. T. stations in the W. T. Establishments. Unimportant W. T. stations may be inspected by the Dy. S. P., Inspector, W. T. once a year, but these should be inspected by the Superintendent of Police, Signals once in two years .

2. The Superintendent of Police, Signals shall also make an annual inspection of each Inspector's work in the Wireless Establishment and shall examine particularly how far the Inspector has supervised work of other subordinates within his jurisdiction and what steps he has taken for the prevention and detection of radio indiscipline and other irregularities.

3. The Superintendent of Police, Signals should examine whether inspections of W. T. Stations by the D. S. P. and Inspectors of Wireless is necessary and if so, specify in a District Order the stations which are to be inspected by each of them.

4. The principal object of inspection is to see that the staff are working properly and efficiently. It is necessary to examine registers, records, kit, equipment, furniture and other Government property, buildings and accounts matters in order to see that they are in good order, that rules are duly observed, that economy is practised, money well spent, correspondence and orders passed receive prompt attention and that the staff are working in close harmony with the District Police staff. The officers and men shall also be examined in their knowledge of their duties, technical ability and of the relevant rules and shall be given such instructions as may be necessary.

5. An inspection register should be maintained at each post and the inspection note recorded therein. Inspection registers are not to be taken into headquarters unless required for reference and shall never be kept there for more than a week.
