

**POLICE ORDER No. 145**

Submission of duplicate copy of Case Diaries to Superintendents of Police by the Inspectors in cases investigated by them.

It has been brought to my notice that Inspectors are not submitting a copy of case diaries to their respective Superintendents of Police in cases investigated by them in accordance with Police Order No. 4/55. As a result, proper control over investigation of these cases is hampered.

Under P. M. Rule 164 the Investigating Officers are required to write case diaries and submit to Circle Inspector or Superintendent of Police who are immediate superiors in order to enable the latter to exercise control and issue necessary instructions. When Circle Inspectors themselves investigate a case the above principle should be followed *mutatis mutandis*. The Circle Inspectors in such cases should write case diaries in triplicate, a copy of which will be sent to Superintendent of Police or immediate superior. The 2nd copy may eventually form part of the records of this office. The original as usual may be sent to court along with C. S. or filed at the Police-station after completion of the investigation.
