

**POLICE ORDER No. 149**

Changes in the designation of officers in the Orissa Police.

As approved by Government in Home Department letter No. 21030-P., dated 7th October 1958 the following changes in the existing designations of Police Officers in Orissa be given effect to from 1st January 1959 to ensure uniformity in this respect on a union basis:—

- (a) "Sergeant-Majors" of the District Police as well as the Orissa Military Police should thereafter be designated as "Reserve Inspectors".
- (b) "Havildars" of the Ordinary Reserve of the District Police should hereafter be designated as "Head Constables". But "Havildars" of the Armed Police Reserves would continue to be called "Havildars" so as to obviate the necessity of effecting any change in the existing designation of "Havildar-Major".
- (c) The abbreviated form of Deputy Superintendent of Police should be "D. S. P." and not "Dy. S. P."

2. Action is being taken to amend the relevant rules of the Orissa Police Manual on account of the changes referred to above.
